THE CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

This Tottenham Flower and Produce Show of flowers, fruit, vegetables, handicrafts and home produce is open and free to all those who wish to enter.

All exhibits of flowers, fruit and vegetables must have been grown by the exhibitors with the exception of classes 140, 141, 176, 180.

Exhibits in classes 129, 130 and 131 must have been cultivated by the exhibitor for a minimum of at least 10 weeks prior to the show.

Exhibits in home made preserves, drinks, cookery, handicrafts, sweets and the children's section must have been made by the exhibitor.

It is FREE to enter the show, no fee is charged.

No more than 3 exhibits per person PER CLASS, please.

Children may enter any class in the Show as well as their own division.

All exhibits and entries must be brought to the Show between 8.30-11.00am on Saturday 9th September 2023.

Exhibitors must bring plates, vases and containers. Water will be made available.

All exhibitors must leave the exhibition tent before Judges make their awards. The judging of exhibits will take place from 12noon and the judges decision is final.

The show will open to the public at approximately 1pm. Any trophies or certificates will be awarded at the discretion of the judges.

A Prize giving ceremony will take place at 3 pm. All 1st Prize winners will receive a medal and a certificate and all second prize winners will receive a certificate. Cups may be available on the day.

The exhibits must not be removed from the show at least until after the prizes have been awarded and displayed, preferably after 4.30 pm. We try to guard your entries unless you say you wish to share food etc.

DIVISION 1: HOME GROWN FRUIT Class

- 100: Apples – with stalks of one variety
- 101: Pears – with stalks of one variety
- 102: Plums – with stalks of one variety
- 103: A Dish of Soft Fruit/berries – home grown
- 104: Any other Fruit – home grown



DIVISION 2: HOME GROWN VEGETABLES Class

- 105: Potatoes – 5 of one variety
- 106: Carrots – 5 of one variety
- 107: Brassicas: Cabbage or Cauliflower – 1 head or collection of heads
- 108: Beans – 5 of 1 type
- 109: Peas – 5 in their pods
- 110: Leeks – 3
- 111: Salad Leaves – a collection of salad leaves – at least 3 types
- 112: Onions – 3
- 113: Cucumber – 1
- 114: Tomatoes – 5 fruit with calyx
- 115: Pumpkin or gourds – 1 or collection of 3
- 116: Marrows or courgettes – 1 or collection of 3
- 117: Peppers – 3 of red, green or yellow
- 118: Chillies – 5 red or green
- 119: Aubergines – 2
- 120: Amaranth – 1 bunch
- 121: Kudu – 1
- 122: Garlic bulb with leaves
- 123: A collection of vegetables – 5 distinct kinds
- 124: Oddest shaped vegetable
- 125: Longest Runner bean
- 126: Best Giant Vegetable (Any type)
- 127: Any other vegetables – 1 or collection of 3



DIVISION 3: HOME GROWN HERBS Class

- 128: 1 bunch of Mixed Herbs

DIVISION 4: HOME GROWN FLOWERS & PLANTS Class

- 129: A Cactus or Succulent – one in a pot

DIVISION 5: HOME GROWN CUT FLOWERS Class

- 132: Roses – 3 blooms of one or more varieties
- 133: Annuals – a mixed collection

- 135: Trees and Shrubs – one spray each of 2 different flowering varieties
- 136: Dahlias – 3 blooms of any variety
- 137: Chrysanthemums – 3 blooms of any variety
- 138: Seed heads – a mixed collection
- 139: Best garden flower – 1-3 blooms



DIVISION 6: FLOWER ARRANGING Class

- 140: Fresh cut flower arrangement – any type
- 141: Dried flower arrangement – in an imaginative container

DIVISION 7: HOME MADE PRESERVES/SAUCES Class

- 142: Jar of Chutney – any kind, any size of jar
- 143: Jar of Pickles – any kind, any size of jar or bottle.
- 144: Jar of any kind of fruit Jam or Jelly – 1lb approx.
- 145: Jar of locally produced honey – 1lb approx.
- 146: Jar of marmalade – 1lb Approx. – any type
- 147: Jar of Hot sauce



DIVISION 8: HOME MADE DRINKS Class

- 148: One bottle of Lemonade
- 149: One bottle of Ginger beer
- 150: One bottle of any other fruit/flower or root drink

DIVISION 9: HOME COOKING Class

- 152: A plate of 6 cookies – any type

- 159: A Victoria sponge cake
- 160: A fruit cake

- 176: A miniature garden in a recycled box or tin – any type
- 177: Cress grown in a pot or in any other way
- 178: A face made from fruit and vegetables
- 179: An edible necklace
- 180: A flower and foliage arrangement in a jam jar
- 181: A painted/printed T-shirt
- 182: A decorated hat made from paper or card
- 183: A model made from recycled materials
- 184: A pot made of papier mache or clay
- 185: A hand made greeting card
- 186: A hand made Christmas tree decoration



DIVISION 11: HANDICRAFTS Class

- 187: A hand-knitted or crocheted article
- 188: An article of embroidery or tapestry
